STATISTICS

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), one in six U.S. children aged 2-8 years (17.4%) had a diagnosed mental, behavioral or developmental disorder (2016).

Mental disorders among children are described as serious changes in the way children typically learn, behave or handle their emotions, causing distress and difficulties getting through the day.

Early diagnosis and appropriate services for children and their families can make a difference in the lives of children with mental disorders.

LCRB-funded programs and services have effectively prevented incidents of child abuse and neglect, homelessness, substance abuse and school-based violence.

By providing a diversified system of care, Lincoln County benefits from a healthier, better educated and more productive population.

Through a voter-approved 1/4 cent sales tax measure passed in 2006, the Lincoln County Resource Board (LCRB) oversees the designated children's services fund for local mental and behavioral health programs.

The LCRB facilitates the establishment, operation and maintenance of a comprehensive system of care—providing prevention, early intervention and crisis programs offered at no out-of-pocket costs for Lincoln County families.

The LCRB funds mental health specialists who can meet children's needs in their homes, schools or communities—removing barriers to care, such as cost and transportation.
